

# CONSTRUCTION SUPERINTENDENT *Certification Program*



NCCER is offering a new joint certification with FMI® to provide industry-wide recognition for construction superintendents. This certification was developed in conjunction with subject matter experts for professionals whose primary role is to oversee the operations of a construction site from planning to completion. This multi-step process helps ensure the construction industry is providing training and recognition for our workforce.

***In order to obtain this certification, candidates must complete the following (order of assessment and institute completion is not important):***

## **Complete and pass the new NCCER Construction Superintendent Assessment**

- Assessment can be aligned to various training programs and successful completions result in an NCCER Knowledge Verified credential.

## **Complete the FMI Field Leadership Institute and provide appropriate documentation**

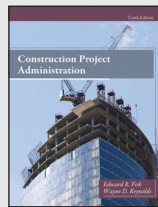
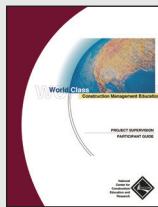
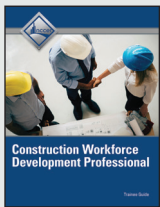

## Assessment Alignments and Curriculum

## Recertification

To maintain this certification, candidates must continue actively working in the industry and provide NCCER with documented experience in the competency areas every three years. The written assessment that resulted in the NCCER Knowledge Verified credential and completion of the FMI Field Leadership Institute do not expire and do not require resubmission.
